Confidence in one's own beauty and uniqueness. Awareness that I am good.

Receiving creation as a gift, awe and respect for creation.

Nyasha sings while she works, she is full of enjoyment and delights in the world around her.

Other people are a gift, we are grateful that they exist.

Nyasha gives the old woman seeds because she is grateful for her advice.

Readiness to respond to the needs of others. Attention.

Nyasha notices the boy and gives him food before he asks.

Recognition of something greater than oneself.
