
LAP BOOK TEMPLATE #6 Travels of the Apostle Paul

The Apostle Paul was born in Tarsus around 10 AD and given the name Saul. His parents were Jewish and he was born into the Tribe of Benjamin. Saul's parents were Roman citizens and so he was a Roman citizen as well.

About 350 years earlier Alexander the Great ruled the area and spread the Greek culture throughout his empire. For this reason, Paul was familiar with the philosophers, literature and language of the Greek people. During Paul's life the most commonly spoken language throughout the Roman Empire was Greek. When Paul wrote to the Christian Churches he wrote in Greek.
