Adam (the first human person) was alone in the garden with God before original sin. His experience of being alone or "solitude" is called ORIGINAL SOLITUDE.


What does God say is not good? _____

God then gave Adam and Eve to one another. We call this ORIGINAL UNITY. At last, Adam is given a partner who is like him (human), but different (female).






3) Draw a line to match the following human experiences to their corresponding Scripture verses.

The LORD God said: It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper suited to him.


Genesis 2:19-20

So the LORD God formed out of the ground all the wild animals and all the birds of the air, and he brought them to the man to see what he would call them; whatever the man called each living creature was then its name. The man gave names to all the tame animals, all the birds of the air, and all the wild animals; but none proved to be a helper suited to the man.

Genesis 2:21-23

So the LORD God cast a deep sleep on the man, and while he was asleep, he took out one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh.

The LORD God then built the rib that he had taken from the man into a woman. When he brought her to the man, the man said: "This one, at last, is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; This one shall be called 'woman,' for out of man this one has been taken."
