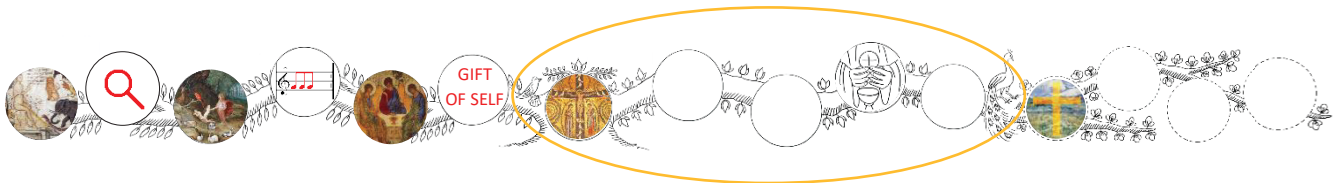

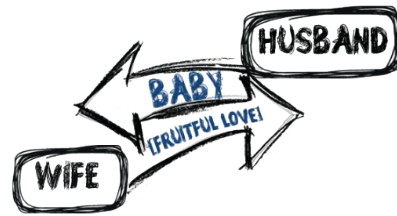
2) Read Figure 1 and Figure 2. Answer the question below.

Figure 2 MADE IN GOD'S IMAGE

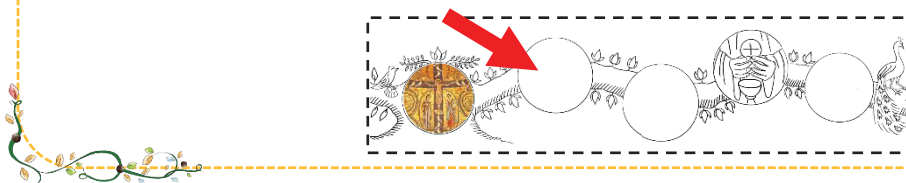


The love between a husband and a wife is so powerful that it can become another person (baby).

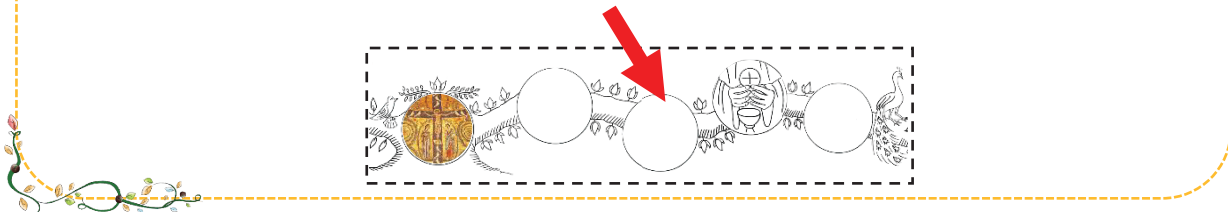
God wants to be in relationship with us. Receiving the Eucharist is the way to enter into communion with God on Earth.





3) Read John 13:34. What is the new commandment that Jesus reveals at the Last Supper?

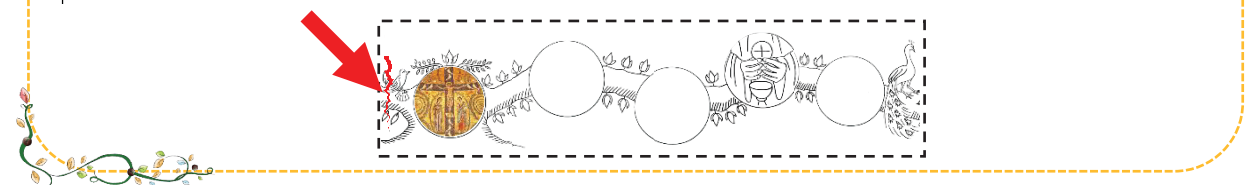

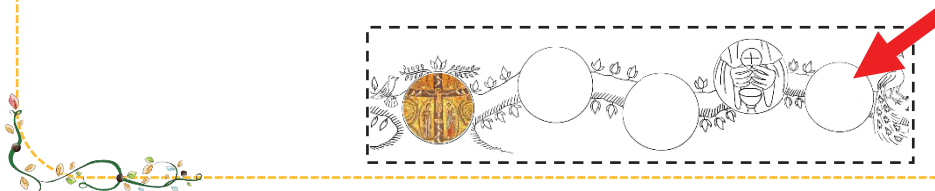
Write a short prayer thanking Jesus for the gift of the Eucharist.

No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends.

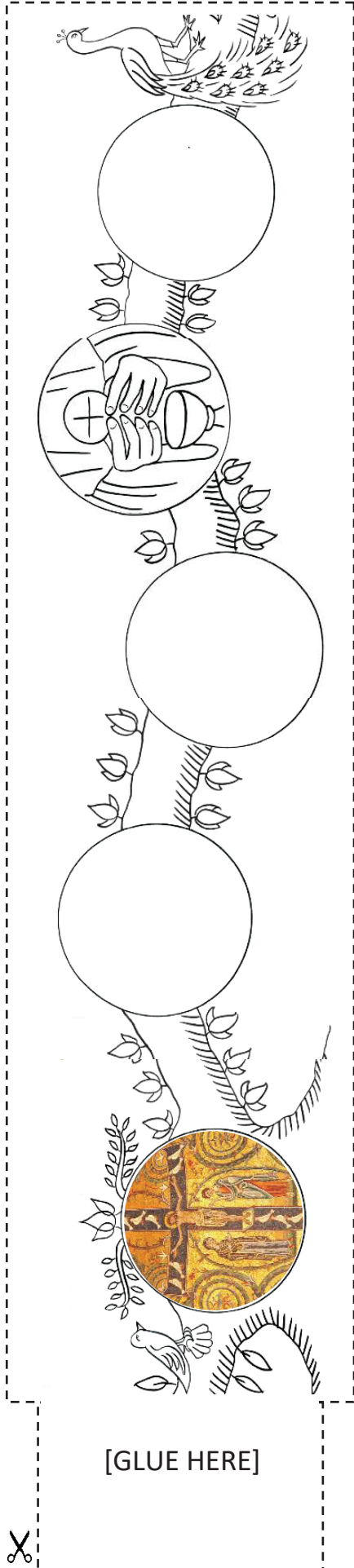
John 15:9
